Glossary

Actively supervise - Parents and carers must have their children within eyesight at all times.

AFFL - Above finished floor level.

Encore - A short performance after the main performance.

TGSI - Tactile ground surface indicators. A tactile ground surface to assist pedestrians who are visually impaired. Often found on footpaths, stairs and train station platforms.

For your Access Key to be successful, we recommend you follow these guidelines.

- Access Keys are available online to help you prepare for your visit in advance.
- · Access Keys should be read and shared in an environment free of distractions.
- Access Keys can be read independently or shared with a friend, family member, carer or support worker to prepare for the visit.
- If sharing the Access Key with participant, help participant comprehend key points, consistently monitoring for level of understanding.
- If sharing the Access Key with participant, contextualised photographs can be used to summarise information and experiences.
- If using the Access Key as a reflective tool, make sure to enjoy the pivotal link between experience and recall after the visit has taken place.
- Once the visit has taken place, revisit the Access Key to celebrate success.

 - Banquet Room (160-seat capacity)
 - The Bendigo Bank Theatre (140 seat capacity).

Train


The V/Line regional train from Southern Cross Station, Melbourne to Bendigo will get you there. The nearest railway station is Bendigo Station, 1.2 kilometres from The Capital.

Bus

The nearest bus stop is at the Queen Elizabeth Oval on View Street, Bendigo, 100 metres from The Capital. Use the regional Eaglehawk bus.

Parking


There is:

- one accessible parking bay in front of The Capital, 30 metres from entrance
- two accessible parking bays at the Queen Elizabeth Oval, 90 metres from the entrance
- a 15-minute parking zone on View Street, at the front of the theatre. This area is also used as a drop off zone
- general parking on surrounding streets throughout the <u>Bendigo Central Business</u> <u>District</u>. Metres and time restrictions may apply

The City of Greater Bendigo has Pay-by-Plate smart parking meters. Coins or credit cards are accepted.

Buses drop off visitors outside the front of The Capital, or park at the nearby Queen Elizabeth Oval.

Bike racks can be found outside the front of The Capital.



Welcome

Welcome to The Capital.

There is stepped and ramped access to the entrance.

Entry to The Capital is through two sets of doors.

The first set are double manual doors, opening outward with a clearance of 1420mm. These doors remain permanently open during operating hours. These doors take visitors into a airlock.

The second set are glass automated doors with a clearance of 1540mm.

There is an undercover area outside the main entrance to the theatre.

The Capital is open one hour prior to any performance.

Our Box Office, located on-site, is open 9am to 5pm, Monday to Friday. The Box Office is located after entry, on the right.

Staff

Front of House and Box Office staff wear casual clothes with name tags.

Ushers wear all black clothing with a pink lanyard and name tags. They may also have radios and ear pieces.

Bar and café staff wear all black clothing with name tags.

The Capital is staffed during performances and events, including one hour prior.

Staff are available at the Box Office from 9am to 5pm, Monday to Friday.

Ground Floor Toilets

Location: Use corridor past the stairs.

Includes:

- · one unisex, accessible toilet with artificial lighting
- manual door opening inward. Door clearance of 900mm. Twist lock at 1050mm AFFL
- cubicle space 2325mm x 1785mm
- grab bars to the left and behind toilet
- toilet seat at height 470mm AFFL with left hand transfer
- sink height 845mm AFFL with lever tap at 880mm AFFL
- baby change area within accessible toilet.

Separate male and female toilets.









Level One Toilets

Location: behind the staircase.

Includes:

- · one unisex, accessible toilet with artificial lighting
- manual door opening inward. Door clearance of 900mm. Twist lock at 1025mm AFFL
- cubicle space 1990mm x 2955mm
- grab bars to the right and behind toilet
- toilet seat at height 470mm AFFL with right hand transfer
- sink height 820mm AFFL with lever tap at 900mm AFFL
- baby change area within accessible toilet.

Separate male and female toilets.

Ticketing

- phone our Box Office on 03 5434 6100
- visit our Box Office on site. The Box Office is open Monday to Friday from 9am to 5pm
- tickets may also be purchased at the Box Office, 1 hour prior to any performance.

It is requested that accessible seating be pre-booked by calling the Box Office on (03) 5434 6100 or visiting. Accessible seating is available in the lower stalls in Row A.

Companion Cards must be presented at the time of booking.

Cash or EFTPOS is accepted.

If visitors require assistance upon arrival, please see Front of House staff or inquire at the Box Office.

A cloaking service is available. Please see a staff at the Box Office.








Ground Floor Foyer

Location: at the end of the entry hallway, to the left.

Includes access to:

- Banquet Room
- Bendigo Bank Theatre
- Lanyon Room.


Level One Foyer

Location: directly ahead of lift and stairs.

Includes access to:

- lower and upper stalls of the auditorium
- Shades Bar, opens 1-hour before performances/events.

The Lanyon Room

Location: off the ground floor foyer.


Entry is through manual doors opening inward with a clearance of 730mm. These can be opened to double doors with a clearance of 1500mm.

The Lanyon Room is primarily used as a place to sit and relax for visitors attending The Capital, before a show and during intermission. It may also be used as a thoroughfare for visitors accessing the lift.

It seats 36 people.

Includes:

- chairs with back and armrests
- chairs with backrests only.





Capital Theatre

Location: on level one.

Access

- Stairs
- Lift; go past the staircase, turn right toward the toilets and enter a hallway on the left.
 Alteratively, you can access the lift via The Lanyon Room.

Overhead signages show which entry doors provide access to rows A-K and L-Z. Accessible entry to the auditorium is via doors that are signed 'Rows A-K'.

Entry door is via a manual door opening outward with a clearance of 700mm. These can be opened to double doors with a clearance of 1440mm.

Accessible seating is available in Row A.

The auditorium has tiered seating with lower and upper stalls.

Feel Heating/Cooling

Shared personal space

The doors open approximately 30 minutes before a show starts and remain open until the performance begins.

During pre-show admission, house lights remain on. Aisle lighting remains on during performances.

Ushers and Front of House staff are available on all doors to check tickets, provide directions and help visitors to seating if required.

Allocated seating is displayed on tickets.

Seating rows have aisle lettering and seats are numbered.

The auditorium seats 480 people.

Bendigo Bank Theatre

Location: off the ground floor foyer.

Entry is via through manual double doors opening outward with a clearance of 1340mm.

The theatre and Choral Stage are used for small theatrical performances, contemporary and fine music events, meetings, conferences, and wedding ceremonies. It is a great venue for music due to its intimacy and excellent acoustics. It can also be used as a dressing room for auditorium performances or a breakout space for larger conferences.

It can be configured for theatre seating, with round/trestle tables and chairs with backrests or for a stand-up reception.

The doors to The Bendigo Bank Theatre open approximately 15 to 20 minutes prior to performances.

Ushers and Front of House staff are available on the door when this room is used for performances. Staff check tickets, provide directions and help visitors to seating if required.

The Bendigo Bank Theatre seats 140 people, depending on the room configuration.

Performances

Events enjoyed at The Capital may include theatre, opera, orchestras, dance, comedy, musicals, and popular contemporary music. The Capital also hosts a number of large and small meetings, conferences and exhibitions annually.

Food and drink may be consumed in the theatre, excluding hot food and drinks.


Some performances may have one or more 20-minute intermissions. There will be an announcement and full house lights will come on.

During intermission, visitors may wish to leave or remain in the theatre. Theatre doors will remain open during intermission.

A chime or bell will ring when intermission has finished.

Large print signage on theatre entry doors will advise if a performance has strobe lighting, haze, loud noises like gunshots or bright lights.

Conclusion of Theatre Events

At the end of performances in the auditorium, full house lights will come on to indicate it's time for visitors to leave.

An announcement may be made to indicate the end of events in the Bendigo Bank Theatre.

Some shows may have an encore. In this case, house lights will remain off. At the end of the encore, full house lights will come on.

When full house lights are on, visitors are requested to leave in an orderly manner. Walking only.

Ushers and Front of House staff are available to guide visitors to exits, including visitors with mobility requirements.

In the auditorium, two additional stepped exit points are open at the conclusion of performances to allow visitors to exit onto View Street. This exit is via manual double doors opening outward with a clearance of 1420mm.

The Banquet Room

Location: off the ground floor foyer.

Entry is through manual double doors opening outward with a clearance of 1260mm.

It is used for conferences, presentations, meetings, and as a tearoom prior to events in other spaces at The Capital. It is also used for wedding catering, for event registrations and as a dressing room for organisations who hire out the auditorium. It is not used for performances.

The Banquet Room can be configured for theatre seating, with round/trestel tables and chairs with backrests or for a stand-up reception. Projector with stage lights can be provided.

Front of House staff may be available at the door if required.

An announcement may be made to indicate the end of and event.

The Banquet Room seats 160 people, depending on the room configuration.

- Taped phone message with information about services and events.
- Access ramp to main entry door length 9m with gradient 1:12 (8%)
- Clear path of travel from outdoor to indoor areas.
- External terrain of concrete and asphalt.
- Visual communication board.
- Internal terrain of carpet.
- Wayfinding signage throughout.
- Wide, clear internal walkways.
- · Clear wheelchair circulation space.
- Spaces for a person using a wheelchair to sit with friends.
- The Lanyon Room can be used as a quiet Space.
- Pram parking. Please see staff at Box Office.
- Discounted entry prices for holders of government issued pension cards and Companion Cards.
- Storage for mobility aids. Please enquire Box Office.
- Wheelchair for loan.
- Disposable ear plugs on request.
- Pen and paper for exchanging information.

- Staff available to read information to visitors.
- Assistance animals welcome.
- Preshow and intermission background music can be turned down on request.
- Staff very accommodating to people of all abilities.
- City of Greater Bendigo customer service team are accredited with Scope Communication Access Symbol, have access to National Relay Service and TIS if needed.

- Box Office counter 1090mm AFFL.
- Shades Bar counter height 1180mm AFFL.



Lift

- Exterior buttons operating height 1210mm AFFL.
- Door clearance 970mm.
- Cubicle space 2100mm X 1100mm.
- Interior buttons operating height 1050mm AFFL.
- Interior buttons with Braille.
- No wheelchair circulation space.

Auditorium

- Rows L-Z entry doors with stepped access only.
- Hearing loop in Rows E-M (seats 5-17).
- Stepped access only to stage from auditorium.

Banquet Room and Bendigo Bank Theatre

- Round table height 750mm AFFL with knee clearance 720mm AFFL.
- Trestle Table height 735mm AFFL.

Safety

Throughout

- Pedestrian crossing from View Street to main entrance.
- Access ramp in front of theatre with single handrail.
- Entry steps to building with steep incline, no colour contrast, no handrails, no TGSI and no stair nosing.
- Main entrance doors and surrounding panels with contrast safety bands 550mm to 2150mm AFFL.
- Main entry airlock with hand sanitiser station 1070mm AFFL.
- Patrolled pathways and nearby carparks.
- No smoking.
- Wet floor signage may be displayed.
- All staff with Working with Children Checks.
- Evacuation maps located throughout.
- Fire wardens on site.
- First aid kit located at Box Office on ground floor.
- Defibrillator is located in the foyer on the ground floor, opposite the staircase.
- Children to be actively supervised at all times.
- Walking only.

- Illuminated exit signs.
- Audible alerts in the case of an emergency.
- In the event of an emergency, staff will help and direct visitors. If there is to be an evacuation, visitors will be directed to the nearest exit and designated assembly area.

Stairs to Level One

- Carpeted.
- · Single handrail.
- No TGSI.
- No stair nosing.

Auditorium

- Stairs to Rows L-Z entry doors with single handrail, no lighting and no TGSI.
- Steps to stage with single handrail and no stair nosing.
- Lower section of auditorium stairs with single handrail, stair nosing and lighting.
- Upper section of auditorium stairs with stair nosing, aisle lighting and no handrails.
