

AROUND BENDIGO YOU CAN....

Take a walk through Rosalind Park on your way to The Capital to watch a show. Get your heart rate up and walk to the top of the Poppet Head and admire the beautiful view of the city at sunset.

Lake Weeroona is a 15 minute walk from the city centre along the pedestrian path. While you're there you can take a stroll along the boardwalk or check out the accessible Weeroona Playspace.

If the kids are wanting to use up some energy, ride a bike from the city centre to the Discovery Centre where they can explore over 100 interactive exhibits. You won't know which one to try first!

Or, if you're in the mood for some history, start at the Bendigo Military Museum and wander down to the Golden Dragon Museum and Chinese Gardens to learn about Bendigo's rich Chinese history. This walk takes approximately 20 minutes.

ACCESSIBLE PARKING SPACES

These bays can only be used for vehicles displaying valid 'Disability Parking (ADP) Permits' (blue label), providing the vehicle has been parked by, or for the convenience of, the permit holder.

Vehicles displaying a 'Double Time Permit' (green label) must not be parked in an accessible parking bay. These vehicles can be parked in a standard parking bay for up to twice the normal time limit for that bay once the fee is paid.

BUSHFIRE PLACES OF LAST RESORT

A Bushfire Place of Last Resort is an area that may, as a last resort, provide some sanctuary from the life threatening effects of a bushfire.

The Bendigo Bushfire Place of Last Resort is the Queen Elizabeth Oval on the corner of View and Barnard Streets.

COMPANION CARD

Companion Cards are issued to people with a significant, permanent disability, who can demonstrate that they are unable to access most community activities and venues without attendant care support. On sighting the Companion Card, participating organisations issue the cardholder with a second ticket for their companion at no charge. Companion Cards can be used on all Victorian public transport. CHANGING PLACES

Changing Places facilities are larger than standard accessible toilets, with extra features and more space to meet the needs of people with disability and their carers. Each facility has a height adjustable, adult-sized changing bench, a tracking hoist system, and space for two people either side of a peninsula toilet.
