A Community Garden Management Plan needs to be submitted as part of your application. At a minimum, the following should be included in your Management Plan:

- Aims and objectives of the group
- How decisions will be made
- The conflict-resolution process
- How new members will be recruited
- Proposed methods of fundraising
- Hours of operation and access
- Methods of gardening

- What plants will be grown
- How organic waste will be managed
- What is the water source and how will water be conserved
- How pests will be controlled
- How vandalism will be prevented
- How you will ensure the site stays tidy
- How you will minimise noise and odour
- An A3-sized basic Concept Plan of the Garden layout.
