In accordance with Rule 6.2.1 of the Governance Rules each Council Meeting must allocate an Agenda Item to allow up to 30 minutes of public question time. However, as this meeting is called for a special purpose this requirement is exempt.

#### 6. DECLARATIONS OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Section 130 of the *Local Government Act 2020* (Vic) (**the Act**) provides that a relevant person must disclose a conflict of interest in respect of a matter and exclude themselves from the decision making process in relation to that matter including any discussion or vote on the matter at any Council meeting or delegated committee meeting and any action in relation to that matter.

The procedure for declaring a conflict of interest at a Council Meeting is set out at rule 18.2.4 of the Governance Rules.

Section 126 of the Act sets out that a relevant person (Councillor, member of a delegated Committee or member of Council staff) has a conflict of interest if the relevant person has a general conflict of interest or a material conflict of interest.

A relevant person has a **general conflict of interest** in a matter if an impartial, fair minded person would consider that the person's private interests could result in that person acting in a manner that is contrary to their public duty.

A relevant person has a **material conflict of interest** in a matter if an *affected person* would gain a benefit or suffer a loss depending on the outcome of the matter.

## **Purpose**

#### **Executive Summary**

The next MAV State Council meeting is scheduled to occur tomorrow Friday June 24, 2022.

The City of Greater Bendigo's (the City) representative, Cr Rod Fyffe, is registered to attend, but has fallen ill. The City's substitute representative, Cr Marg O'Rourke, is unavailable to attend.

Only representatives, as resolved by Council, are entitled to vote on matters before State Council in accordance with the <u>MAV rules</u>.

#### Background

The MAV is a membership association and the legislated peak body for local government in Victoria. The City is a member council.

The State Council is the governing body of MAV and meet at least twice each year to consider and vote upon member business.

#### Report

The next MAV State Council meeting will be held from 9.00 am to 4.00 pm on Friday 24 June 2022 at Sofitel Melbourne on Collins, 25 Collins Street Melbourne.

The City has submitted the Motion 58 Inclusionary Zoning, to the MAV Agenda and Business Paper (at page 242 of pack, numbered as page 93).
